Submission Instructions

Prospective authors are cordially invited to submit original papers using the electronic submission system at the Symposium web page. Papers in English following the IEEE conference style are expected.

Types of submissions:

- **Regular Papers** (6 pages) presenting novel and completed research work.
- **Student Papers** (4 pages) presenting novel, promising research results; the first author must be a student.
- **Embedded tutorials, Special Sessions** (3 pages for the proposal including the title, extended abstract, and speakers' short bios). Preparing a paper for accepted tutorials and special sessions is optional. For accepted special sessions, speakers can create a joint paper (up to 8 pages). Another option is to submit individual contributions as regular papers that will undergo the standard review process. Accepted papers will be presented in the same session.

DDECS 2026 will produce Formal Proceedings of accepted papers that will be submitted for possible inclusion in the IEEE Xplore Digital Library.
